

Problems Encounters :

Though 'Save Bird Save Nature' project was initiated with ideal thought and garnered appreciation from all corners of society, it encountered many challenges. Problems:

a) Availability of Fund

It is the known fact that 'Army marches on its stomach'. Without availability of fund, the whole practice seemed useless. The biggest problem was the paucity of fund. Making artificial nests and feeding pans and water bowl was challenge.







Best Practice No: 2

Title of the practice :

Bird Restaurent at Rajbhavan bio diversity Park (Residence of Government of Maharashtra state) District Nagpur was started on January 2017 to save birds and save nature.

Goal :

- 1. The idea behind starting the bird restaurant is to save birds as the birds are an integral part of the ecosystem.
- 2. Birds have helped us to shape the plant life we see around us and around the world.
- 3. They keep the climate stable, oygenate air and transform pollutants into nutrients.

The context :

The college had started bird restaurant in the Raj Bhavan biodiversity park (Residence of Government of Maharashtra state) District Nagpur. The objective of this project is

- 1. To provide a source of uninterrupted source of food to a maimum number of bieds
- 2. To make water and food easily accessible and to help maintain the bird population in seasons of food scarcity like the summers and winters.
- 3. To provide energy to birds such as during temperature extremes, migration and in late winters when natural seed sources are depleted.
- 4. This practice is of great importance especially in an urban environment where the birds are benefitted from the food they find in the park.

The Practice :

The hon'ble Principal Professor Pravin Charde of the institution has taken the initiative by constituting the committee to start the bird restaurant at Raj Bhavan Nagpur. The convenor is Dr Mrs S.S. Mandavgade and other members are Dr Mrs P. P Chahande, Dr Mrs A.S. Mahakalkar

The activity is carried out by the collection of fund from teaching and non teaching staff members. The members arrange 100 kg of grains every month for this activity and visit the Raj Bhavan Nagpur and donate grains to the authorities present there. These grains are then used to feed the birds like Peacocks, sparrows, parrots and various other types of birds. This activity helps in the sustainability of hundreds of birds, present in the locality around Raj Bhavan which indirectly help in balancing the food and environmental cycles in the region. The feed not only acts as a good source of nutrition to the birds but also to their offspring which raises their chances of survival thus contributing towards maintaining the bird population.

Evidence of success :

- 1. A positive opinion is received from the staff of Raj Bhavan Biodiversity Park from their feedback.
- A Letter of appreciation was received from the authority for successfully running the project
- 3. The number of Birds in Raj Bhavan has increased.






