Lippan art, also known as mud and mirror work, is a traditional craft originating from the Kutch region of Gujarat, India. It involves creating intricate designs using clay mixed with camel dung or other materials often embedded with small mirrors to produce a shimmering effect. Traditionally, it adorned the walls of mud houses serving both aesthetic and insulating purposes.

Material : Clay ,camel dung ,and mirrors adhesive.

Designs : Geometric and nature inspired like flowers, leafs, peacocks.

Cultural significance : Reflects folklore and spirituality.

Practical use : Helps maintain cooler interiors in traditional homes.

Contemporary adaptations of Lippan art incorporate modern techniques and use polymer clay, acrylic paints and vibrant colours making it suitable for modern interiors while preserving its cultural essence.

Taking into consideration its popularity and beautifulness, The department of resource management decided to organize a workshop on LIPPAN ART for the students of Home science. First of all we took the permission from the principal madam and then contacted the resource person from pidilite company. 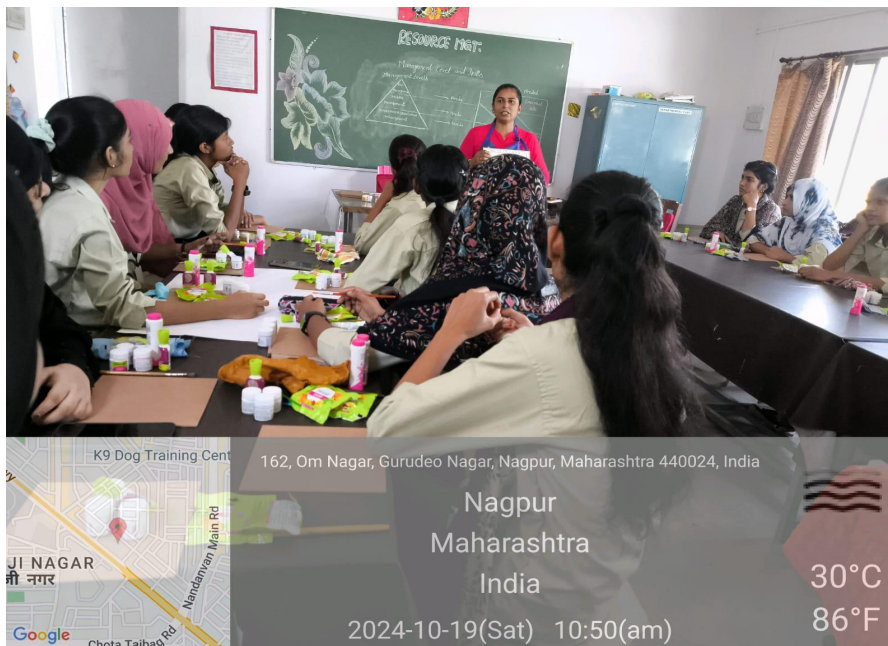

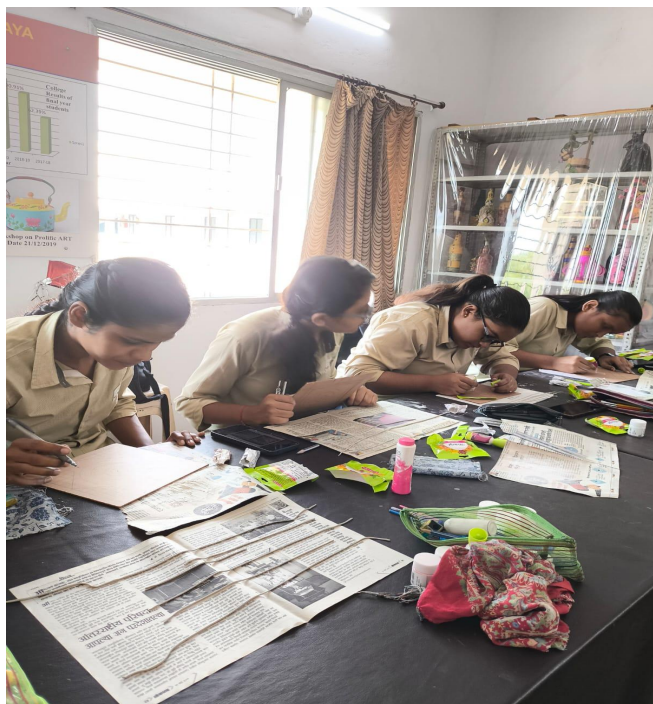
Though the workshop is taken with the help of pidilite company, participants of the workshop got certificate of participation from the company.
